Professional Experience

Torii Station Education Center Counselor (40 hrs, 09/2017-04/2018)

As an education counselor, I've provided many services to the education center including: Social Media & Technology Coordinator, Marketing strategist, Education Center Media Representative, Education & Career counselor. I provided guidance to individual soldiers to help them choose an educational path that would benefit their careers and life after their service. I also researched information, created powerpoint presentations, and facilitated briefings (commissioning, educational, general services). Collegiate Courses Taught

Online Academic Skills Course (20 hrs, 07/2017-09/2017)

A general technician improvement course for collegiate students which focuses on the areas of word knowledge, reading comprehension, and math abilities (algebraic expressions and word problems. I created the curriculum for each class consisting of quizzes, lessons, worksheets, media clips, practice tests, and powerpoint slides. "Teaching is a particular strength for Hillary. Theatre in Society (Adjunct Professor 20hrs 08/2016-12/2016, Kennesaw State University)

A general education course in which students from all majors are given the basics of theatre in today's society. The curriculum I developed for this course included activities, group projects, small group discussions, presentations and lectures focused on theatre as it relates to current events and social trends in society. Students were given the basic skills in public speaking and voice projection. Students were required to collaborate with their groups to produce their own theatrical production.

Voice for the Actor- Lessac (TA - 20hrs 08/2015-12/2015, Instructor 01/2016-05/2016 40 hrs, University of Southern Mississippi)
In this course, I created a curriculum based on the vocal and physical methods and techniques for use in the theatre rooted in the work of Arthur Lessac. I created specific lesson plans for each class which outlined activities, tests, quizzes, simulations and group assignments. Students work at an advanced level in kinesthetics, phonetics and kinesensic training. Students are required to apply both the vocal techniques and specialized Lessac & phonetic annotation to their texts. Students are given various speech topics to apply the techniques they've learned throughout the week.

Voice For the Actor-Voice Over Acting (TA- 20hrs 01/2016-05/2016, University of Southern Mississippi)

In this course, I developed a curriculum for theatre majors which explores the recording, sound production and art of voice over acting. Students are to apply phonetics, kinesthetics and vocal projection techniques to their voice over projects. With my assistance, students record and engineer their own voice over recordings. To conclude the class, students create their own voice over demos with the techniques and dialects they've learned in class.

Theatre Appreciation (20hrs 08/2014-12/2014, 20hrs 01/2015-05/2016, 20hrs 01/2016-05/2016, University of Southern Mississippi)

For this course, I created a curriculum which included an introductory analysis of theatre, projects & activities, lectures, simulations, and media clips focused on theatre as an art form reflecting the aesthetic aspects and social conditions of a culture. Students learn about the basics of theatre production and the many roles involved in producing theatre. Students are exposed to different types of theatre and are given the opportunity to speak with current theatre artists. Students are required to create a final project in which they collaborate with their peers to produce their own theatrical production.

Acting for Non-majors (Substitute- 4hrs 03/2015, University of Southern Mississippi)

This is an introductory acting technique course using modern scene studies and improvisation specifically designed for interested non-theatre students. In this course, I stepped in a few times for a colleague and proctored exams in which students were performing contrasting scenes and monologues. I gave students feedback which each presentation and conducted a speech workshop.

Musical Theatre & Acting Teacher for Da Vinci International School (Okinawa, Japan Spring/Fall 18' 19')

- Created a Musical theatre program for High school and Middle school age children in which they learned to analyze musical theatre songs, read music, and perform them. Students learned group numbers, vocal warm-ups, physical wellness for the voice and body, as well as acting through song.
- I created an Acting program for High school and Middle age children in which
 they learned acting skills specifically in the areas of voice, body, character
 analysis, and improvisation. Students worked in groups, pairs, and on solo pieces
 where they would analyze, rehearse, memorize, and perform their pieces.
 Students also learned how to put the acting skills the acquired in an
 improvisational setting.

Teaching Artist for Kenny Leon's True Colors Theatre (20hrs 08/2016-03/2017)

- Taught theatre workshops and provided one on one acting and speech coaching to students
- Served as a judge for the August Wilson competition
